Powell	02/05/03	Al-Qaida continues to have a deep interest in acquiring weapons of mass destruction. As with the story of Zarqawi and his network, I can trace the story of a senior terrorist operative telling how Iraq provided training in these weapons to al-Qaida...He says bin Laden and his top deputy in Afghanistan, deceased al-Qaida leader Muhammad Atif, did not believe that al-Qaida labs in Afghanistan were capable enough to manufacture these chemical or biological agents. Rice	03/09/03	The strongest link of--of Saddam Hussein to al-Qaida--we've never said that he somehow masterminded 9/11 or was even involved in 9/11. ...But the strongest links to al-Qaida are really two. ...And secondly, a very strong link to training al-Qaida in chemical and biological weapons techniques. We know from a detainee that--the head of training for al-Qaida, that they sought help in developing chemical and biological weapons because they weren't doing very well on their own. Feith	02/21/03	Well if you're focused specifically on the question of the links between the Saddam Hussein regime and al-Qaeda, people who do not see the link are just not familiar with the evidence, much of which we have in recent months talked about publicly. There have been linkages between the Iraqi government and al-Qaeda going back more or less a decade. They have involved co-operation between the Iraqi intelligence and al-Qaeda operatives on training and combined operations regarding bomb making and chemical and biological weapons.	ABC Interview
