

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




Marine Corps Personnel Strength

Civilian Personnel





- ➤ <u>Management Headquarters:</u> 20% reduction over the FYDP begins with the elimination of 328 HQ FTEs in FY15.
- ➤ <u>Ship Maintenance</u>: Continued focus on ship maintenance (including nuclear manning).
- ➤ <u>Shipyard Firefighting Capability:</u> Increase to strengthen fire emergency response capability.







- **Executive Helo:** Supports start of SDD with Milestone C scheduled for FY 19.




