- Mitsubishi Motors Corporation issued a recall November 10 for 194,616 of its model years 2007 2015 Mitsubishi Outlander and Outlander Sport crossover vehicles due to separate issues affecting the vehicles' windshield wipers. *TheCarConnection.com* (See item 1)

- 1. November 10, The Car Connection.com (National) Mitsubishi Outlander, Outlander Sport recalled for windshield wiper woes: 195,000 vehicles affected. Mitsubishi Motors Corporation issued a recall November 10 for 194,616 of its model years 2007 2015 Mitsubishi Outlander and Outlander Sport crossover vehicles sold in the U.S. due to separate issues affecting the vehicles' windshield wipers, both of which can lead to corrosion, thereby preventing the windshield wipers from working properly. - 2. November 10, U.S. Department of Labor (Ohio) Fuyao America Glass racks up \$227K in OSHA penalties following six complaint inspections at Ohio auto glass plant in 2016. The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Fuyao Glass America Inc. with a total of 23 serious safety violations and 1 other-than-serious violation November 10 after complaints of unsafe working conditions prompted 8 separate Federal inspections at the Moraine, Ohio facility which revealed multiple machine safety violations that exposed workers to amputation and electrical hazards, and found that the company failed to provide personal protective equipment, among other violations. Proposed penalties total \$226,937.

3. November 10, SecurityWeek – (International) IoT worm could hack all smart lights in a city. Researchers from the Weizmann Institute of Science in Israel and Dalhousie University in Canada demonstrated that an Internet of Things (IoT) worm targeting Philips Hue smart light bulbs could cause significant disruptions and outages to lighting systems in a city due to an issue related to the ZLL Touchlink protocol. The worm relies on the ZigBEE wireless technology to spread form one smart lamp to another, and enables the attacker to switch the smart bulbs on or off, permanently brick them, or abuse them for large-scale distributed denial-of-service (DDoS) attacks. - 6. November 12, WDRB 41 Louisville (Kentucky) Crews respond to 22-car train derailment in Hardin County. Authorities are investigating after 22 cars of a CSX train derailed along Highway 434 in Hardin County, Kentucky, November 12, causing plastic pellets to spill on the tracks and prompting officials to close Highway 434 between Joe Prather Highway to Happy Hollow Road until at least November 14. No injuries were reported.

- 7. November 12, Prescott Daily Courier (Arizona) Child dies in Highway 89 accident. Both directions of Arizona State Route 89 from Road 5 North to Old Highway 89 in Chino Valley, Arizona, were closed for several hours November 11 after a pedestrian was fatally struck by a vehicle. - 8. November 11, East Bay Times (California) Martinez: Man killed in Highway 4 collision. Highway 4 between Martinez and Hercules, California, was closed for more than 2 hours November 11 following a 2-vehicle collision that caused 1 vehicle to run off the roadway and overturn. One person was killed.

- 9. November 14, U.S. Department of Agriculture (Illinois; Indiana; Missouri) Schnuck Markets Inc. recalls ready-to-eat chicken breast products that may be undercooked. Schnuck Markets Inc. issued a recall November 12 for roughly 62 pounds of its ready-to-eat "Butter Garlic Marinated Grilled Chicken Breast" products after an internal investigation into a consumer complaint revealed that the chicken products may be undercooked. No adverse reactions have been reported and the products were shipped to 26 Schnuck retail locations in Missouri, Illinois, and Indiana. - 10. November 11, U.S. Food and Drug Administration (National) Agave Dream recalls several flavors of ice creams in pint size containers because of possible health risk. Agave Dream issued a recall November 10 for its ice cream products sold in 5 variations after Federal personnel discovered samples that tested positive for Listeria monocytogenes in the facility of the firm's contract manufacturer, Dr. Bob's of Upland, LLC, and in finished product of another firm's brand also manufactured at Dr. Bob's. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed via retail outlets nationwide.

11. November 11, U.S. Food and Drug Administration – (National) Free2b Foods issues allergy alert on undeclared milk ingredient in chocolate Sun Cups. Free2b Foods issued a recall November 10 for its chocolate Sun Cups products sold in single cup and double cup-packages due to the potential presence of undeclared milk ingredients in the products. One adverse reaction has been reported and the products were distributed via retail outlets nationwide.

November 10, U.S. Food and Drug Administration – (National) Chocolate Shoppe Ice Cream Company expands recall of select products containing chocolate chip cookie dough pieces purchased from outside supplier Aspen Hills due to possible health risk. Chocolate Shoppe Ice Cream Company, Inc. expanded a previous recall November 10 for select ice cream products due to potential Listeria monocytogenes contamination in a chocolate chip cookie dough ingredient supplied by Aspen Hills, Inc. The products were distributed to various ice cream shops, via the Internet, and to limited grocery establishments nationwide.

- 13. November 14, KAFF 92.9 FM Flagstaff (Arizona) Water boil order issued for Doney Park. Coconino County, Arizona officials issued a boil water advisory November 14 for Doney Park following the discovery of E.coli in the town's water supply November 9. - 14. November 14, WXYZ 7 Detroit (Michigan) Boil water advisory issued for Troy and Rochester Hills after 7-foot water main break. Officials issued a boil water advisory November 13 for Troy and Rochester Hills, Michigan, following a 7-foot water main break. The cause of the water main break remains under investigation.

15. November 11, U.S. Department of Justice – (Texas) Jury convicts home health agency owner in \$13 million Medicare fraud conspiracy. A co-owner of Houston-based Fiango Home Healthcare Inc. was convicted November 10 for her role in a \$13 million Medicare fraud and money laundering scheme where she and co-conspirators submitted fraudulent claims to Medicare for home-health services that were medically unnecessary or not provided, paid illicit kickbacks to physicians in exchange for authorizing the home-health services for Medicare beneficiaries, and used the money Medicare paid for the claims to pay kickbacks to patient recruiters for referring Medicare beneficiaries for services from February 2006 – June 2015. The group also falsified medical records to show that the Medicare beneficiaries qualified for and received Fiango's home-health services.

- 16. November 14, WNCN 17 Goldsboro; Associated Press (North Carolina) 1,400 firefighters battle NC mountain wildfires that now top 33,000 acres. About 1,400 firefighters worked November 13 to contain over a dozen wildfires that have scorched roughly 34,000 acres in the North Carolina mountains. Officials issued an evacuation order for part of Chimney Rock in Rutherford County near Lake Lure and mandatory evacuation orders remain in place for five other counties across the State.

in Fannin County, Georgia, grew to roughly 17,000 acres while containment remained at 20 percent.

19. November 11, SecurityWeek – (National) U.S. authorities reach settlement with Adobe over 2013 breach. Authorities in 15 States reached a \$1 million settlement with Adobe Systems November 10 after the company reportedly failed to employ reasonable measures to protect its customers' personal information and detect malicious activity within its network, causing a massive data breach in 2013 that compromised over 150 million records. As part of the settlement, Adobe agreed to institute new policies and practices to prevent future breaches, including effectively separating payment card data from public-facing servers, performing ongoing risk assessments, and providing security training to employees, among other practices.

20. November 11, SecurityWeek – (International) Low-bandwidth "BlackNurse" DDoS attack can disrupt firewalls. Researchers from Danish telecom operator TDC warned that certain distributed denial-of-service (DDoS) attacks based on the Internet Control Message Protocol (ICMP) Type 3 Code 3 packets, dubbed "BlackNurse" can be highly effective over low bandwidths and can cause firewalls, including Cisco Adaptive Security Appliance (ASA) and SonicWall, to enter a temporary denial-of-service (DoS) condition. TDC reported that all the firewalls observed recovered once the DDoS attacks stopped.

21. November 10, SecurityWeek – (International) High severity DoS flaw patched in OpenSSL. The OpenSSL Project released OpenSSL 1.1.0c resolving three vulnerabilities after a Google security researcher discovered a heap-based buffer overflow associated with Transport Layer Security (TLS) connections using ChaCha20-Poly1305 cipher suites that can lead to a denial-of-service (DoS) condition, which could result in a crash of OpenSSL. The update also addresses a moderate severity flaw that can cause applications to crash, and a low severity issue related to the

Broadwell-specific Montgomery multiplication procedure.

22. November 14, WSOC 9 Charlotte – (North Carolina) 3-alarm fire at South End townhomes ruled arson, fire officials say. Nearly 60 firefighters worked November 14 to contain a 3-alarm fire at a construction site in the South End neighborhood of Charlotte, North Carolina, that caused \$2 million in damages, prompted the evacuation of nearby apartment buildings, and shut down several area roads. No injuries were reported and officials are investigating the fire as a case of arson.

No injuries were reported and the cause of the fire remains under investigation.
