## **Top Stories**

- A man dubbed the "Faceless Bandit" was charged November 14 for allegedly robbing or attempting to rob 4 banks in Los Angeles County and Orange County, California, in October. Southern California City News Service (See item 3)

1. November 14, KRON 4 San Francisco – (California) Gas leak capped in San Jose, most evacuations lifted. Crews worked November 14 to cap a 6-inch gas line leak in San Jose, California, that prompted a roughly 5-hour evacuation of surrounding homes and businesses. Officials reported that around 40 customers were without gas services for several hours while crews repaired the line.

2. November 14, Monroe News – (Michigan) Fermi 2 back online after maintenance. DTE Energy Co. reported that the Unit 2 boiling water reactor at its Enrico Fermi Nuclear Generating Station in Newport, Michigan, returned online November 13 after it was taken offline November 7 to repair a main unit transformer. The plant was operating at 70 percent power November 14 and is expected to return to full capacity after more tests are completed.

A portion of Highway 38 in Caledonia, Wisconsin, was closed for more than 8 hours November 14 after a vehicle traveling westbound reportedly crossed the center line and struck a semi-truck, causing a large amount of diesel to spill on the roadway. Both drivers were transported to area hospitals with injuries. One person was killed. Both directions of Interstate 277 at Interstate 76 east in Akron, Ohio, were closed for several hours November 14 after a garbage disposal truck overturned, spilling its load of trash on the roadway.

- 8. November 13, KEYE 42 Austin (Texas) Overturned 18-wheeler spills 2,700 gallons of fuel in Burnet Co. U.S. 183 near Briggs, Texas, was closed for more than 7 hours November 12 after a semi-truck overturned, spilling about 2,700 gallons of fuel onto the roadway and into Rocky Creek. HAZMAT crews responded and officials estimated cleanup could take up to 2 weeks to complete.

November 15, Associated Press (Ohio) **Fast-moving barn fire kills 22,000 chickens.** A November 15 fire at a poultry operation in Nova Township, Ohio, killed over 22,000 chickens and destroyed thousands of eggs after a reported electrical issue caused the barn to ignite. **fish turn up in Shinnecock Canal on Long Island.** The New York Department of Environmental Conservation is investigating after tens of thousands of dead Atlantic menhaden (bunker) fish turned up in the Shinnecock Canal in Hampton Bays November 14 due to an alleged shortage of oxygen and high fish density in the water. The Suffolk County Health Department collected water samples as a precaution to test for possible pathogens and pesticides.

- 11. November 14, U.S. Food and Drug Administration (National) Ashby's Sterling Ice Cream recalls Peanut Butter Landslide Ice Cream due to health risk; this is related to expanded recall by outside supplier Aspen Hills. House of Flavors, Inc. issued a voluntary recall November 11 for a select lot of its Ashby's Sterling Peanut Butter Landslide Ice Cream products sold in 3-gallon containers due to possible contamination with Listeria monocytogenes in the peanut butter cookie dough ingredient supplied by Aspen Hills, Inc. No illnesses have been reported and the products were sold to distributors and ice cream shops nationwide.

- 12. November 14, U.S. Food and Drug Administration (National) Cedar Crest Specialties, Inc. issues recall on Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough, Monster Cookie and Pirate's Bounty ice cream as a result of Aspen Hills, Inc. cookie dough recall. Cedar Crest Specialties, Inc. issued a recall November 10 for its Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough, Monster Cookie, and Pirate's Bounty ice cream products after the firm was notified that the cookie dough ingredient supplied by Aspen Hills, Inc. has the potential to be contaminated with Listeria. - 13. November 14, U.S. Food and Drug Administration (International) Marine Agrifuture, LLC. recalls "Kahuku Ogo," "Robusta Ogo" and "Kahuku Sea Asparagus" because of possible health risk. Marine Agrifuture, LLC issued a recall November 14 for several variations of its "Kahuku Ogo," "Robusta Ogo," and "Kahuku Sea Asparagus" products after special assessments by the Hawaii Department of Health revealed the presence of Salmonella in saltwater used in the farm production and processing areas for the products. Fourteen cases of Salmonella have been reported on Oahu in connection with the recall and the products were distributed to seafood and produce distributors via direct delivery in Hawaii and to customers in three other States and Tokyo, Japan.

November 14, U.S. Food and Drug Administration – (National) Voluntary recall of Weight Watchers Smart Ones Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough Sundae due to possible health risks from cookie dough pieces purchased from a third party supplier. Weight Watchers International issued a voluntary recall November 14 for roughly 100,000 cases of its Weight Watchers Smart Ones Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough Sundae frozen dessert products sold in 4-pack containers after Aspen Hills, Inc.

reported that the cookie dough ingredient supplied to the firm tested positive for Listeria monocytogenes. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to retail outlets nationwide.

23. November 15, SecurityWeek – (International) Cryptsetup flaw exposes Linux systems to attacks. Security researchers discovered a vulnerability affecting the disk encryption utility Cryptsetup that could allow attackers with physical access to a targeted Linux system to gain root access to the system, and copy, modify, or destroy data on the hard disk by holding down the "Enter" key for approximately 70 seconds during boot. The flaw occurs when the system partition is encrypted using the Linux Unified Key Setup (LUKS) disk encryption standard, and is due to the incorrect handling of password checks.

24. *November 15*, *SecurityWeek* – (International) **Kovter trojan fuels spike in new malware variants.** Symantec released a report which revealed that the number of new malware variants increased from roughly 50.1 million in September to 96.1 million in October due to the Kovter trojan family. The report also revealed that the RIG exploit

kit (EK) accounted for 37.4 percent of the EK activity spotted during October, among other findings.

25. November 14, SecurityWeek – (International) Hackers find code execution flaw in VMware Workstation. VMware released a patch resolving a critical out-of-bounds memory access vulnerability in its Workstation Player and Pro 12.x, and Fusion Pro 8.x products that can be exploited from the guest to execute arbitrary code on the host operating system (OS) running the products if the drag-and-drop and copy-and-paste functions are enabled.
